

## 2021 Nā Koa Virtual Golf Tournament Callaway Scoring System

- Everyone plays their own ball and will have an individual score
- Double Par is max score for each hole. Players scores must be reflected on the scorecard as their total strokes for each hole. For example, “5” and not “+1” for a score on a Par 4.
- A player’s score under the Callaway Scoring System is determined by deducting the worst individual holes during the round plus a handicap adjustment. Two holes must count and cannot be deducted. For the Na Koa Virtual Tournament, those holes are determined to be:
  - Hawaii Prince Golf Course
    - Holes A9, B9 and/or C9
  - Course of your choice
    - 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> holes
- The individual golfer’s net scores will be determined using the Callaway Scoring System Chart (See chart on page 2). The golfer’s gross score is found on the chart and number of worst holes taken is reflected under the “handicap deduction” column. Half-scores are rounded up. If a player is deducting half of 7, then that 3.5 is rounded up to 4. The maximum a golfer can deduct is 50 strokes. Sample Scorecard at Hawaii Prince Golf Course:

Player 1 – Shot 71. On the chart, they are a “scratch”. If you shoot par or below, you are automatically a “scratch golfer”. This player’s net score is **71** (71 – 0).

Player 2 – Shot 89. On the chart, we will take the 2 worst hole scores of 7 (B1) + 6 (A2) = 13. In addition, under the score of 89 and in the “Handicap Adjustment” row, they would also get a +1 adjustment for a handicap of 14 (13 + 1). This player’s net score is **75** (89 – 14).

Player 3 – Shot 118. On the chart, we will take the 5 worst hole scores of 8 (A1) + 8 (A6) + 8 (B3) + 7 (A2) + 7 (A7) = 38. In addition, under the score of 118 and in the “Handicap Adjustment” row, they get an adjustment of 0 for a handicap of 38 (38 + 0). This player’s net score is **80** (118 – 38).

Player 4 – Shot 102. On the chart, we will take the 3 ½ worst hole scores of 8 (A6) + 7 (A1) + 7 (A2) + 4 (half of B3’s score rounded up) = 26. In addition, under the score of 102 and in the “Handicap Adjustment” row, they would also get a -1 adjustment for a handicap of 25 (26 – 1). This player’s net score is **77** (102 – 25).

The Team’s score for the tournament is **75.75** (71 + 75 + 80 + 77 divided by 4)

- If there are ties in the team scores, the tiebreaker will be the total team score for the 1<sup>st</sup> Par 5 the team plays. If there is a tie then the next Par 5 they play, etc. If there is still a tie the comparison will go to the total team score for the first Par 4. For those playing on a 27-hole golf course like Hawaii Prince, it is the responsibility of the team to indicate on their scorecard, which 9-hole course they played first and second.
- Participating teams are strongly encouraged to play their round on a Par 72 course. Adjustment will be made at the discretion of the Na Koa Golf Committee for those teams playing on a course with a different Par designation.
